

Worshipers arrive in silence.

Please stand

All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned and gone our own way. And on One has been laid the iniquity of us all. Christ became obedient unto death, Even death on a cross.

Gracious God, on this day we gather to remember with love and tears the suffering and death of Jesus of Nazareth. We believe that this despised and rejected man of sorrows has borne our griefs and has been wounded for our transgressions. We come to this worship in deep repentance for our individual sins and in recommitment of our lives to end suffering, pain, and death in all times and all places. **Amen** 

### Man of Sorrows



First Reading: Isaiah 52:13-53:12

See, my servant shall prosper;
he shall be exalted and lifted up,
and shall be very high.

14 Just as there were many who were astonished at him
—so marred was his appearance, beyond human
semblance,
and his form beyond that of mortals—

15 so he shall startle many nations;
kings shall shut their mouths because of him;
for that which had not been told them they shall see,
and that which they had not heard they shall contemplate.

53Who has believed what we have heard?
And to whom has the arm of the Lord been revealed?

<sup>2</sup>For he grew up before him like a young plant,
and like a root out of dry ground;
he had no form or majesty that we should look at him,
nothing in his appearance that we should desire him.

<sup>3</sup>He was despised and rejected by others;
a man of suffering\* and acquainted with infirmity;
and as one from whom others hide their faces
he was despised, and we held him of no account.

<sup>4</sup>Surely, he has borne our infirmities and carried our diseases; yet we accounted him stricken, struck down by God, and afflicted. <sup>5</sup>But he was wounded for our transgressions, crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the punishment that made us whole, and by his bruises we are healed. <sup>6</sup>All we like sheep have gone astray; we have all turned to our own way, and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all.

7He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he did not open his mouth; like a lamb that is led to the slaughter, and like a sheep that before its shearers is silent, so he did not open his mouth.

8By a perversion of justice, he was taken away. Who could have imagined his future?

For he was cut off from the land of the living, stricken for the transgression of my people.

9They made his grave with the wicked and his tomb\* with the rich, although he had done no violence, and there was no deceit in his mouth.

<sup>10</sup>Yet it was the will of the Lord to crush him with pain. When you make his life an offering for sin, he shall see his offspring, and shall prolong his days; through him the will of the Lord shall prosper.

he shall find satisfaction through his knowledge.

The righteous one,\* my servant, shall make many righteous,
and he shall bear their iniquities.

12 Therefore I will allot him a portion with the great, and he shall divide the spoil with the strong; because he poured out himself to death, and was numbered with the transgressors; yet he bore the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors.

¹My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?
Why so far from saving me, so far from the words of my groaning?
²My God, I cry out by day, but you do not answer; by night, but I find no rest.

<sup>3</sup>Yet you are the Holy One, enthroned on the praises of Israel.

4Our ancestors put their trust in you, they trusted, and you rescued them. R

<sup>5</sup>They cried out to you and were delivered; they trusted in you and were not put to shame.

<sup>6</sup>But as for me, I am a worm and not human, scorned by all and despised by the people.

7All who see me laugh me to scorn; they curl their lips; they shake their heads.

8"Trust in the LORD; let the LORD deliver; let God rescue him if God so delights in him." R

<sup>9</sup>Yet you are the one who drew me forth from the womb,

and kept me safe on my mother's breast.

<sup>10</sup>I have been entrusted to you ever since I was born;

you were my God when I was still in my mother's womb.

<sup>11</sup>Be not far from me, for trouble is near, and there is no one to help.

<sup>12</sup>Many young bulls encircle me; strong bulls of Bashan surround me. R

<sup>13</sup>They open wide their jaws at me, like a slashing and roaring lion.

<sup>14</sup>I am poured out like water; all my bones are out of joint;

my heart within my breast is melting wax.

<sup>15</sup>My strength is dried up like a potsherd; my tongue sticks to the roof of my mouth; and you have laid me in the dust of death.

<sup>16</sup>Packs of dogs close me in, a band of evildoers circles round me; they pierce my hands and my feet. R

<sup>17</sup>I can count all my bones while they stare at me and gloat.

<sup>18</sup>They divide my garments among them; for my clothing, they cast lots.

<sup>19</sup>But you, O LORD, be not far away; O my help, hasten to my aid.

<sup>20</sup>Deliver me from the sword, my life from the power of the dog.

<sup>21</sup>Save me from the lion's mouth!
From the horns of wild bulls you have rescued me.

<sup>22</sup>I will declare your name to my people; in the midst of the assembly I will praise you. R

- <sup>23</sup>You who fear the LORD, give praise! All you of Jacob's line, give glory. Stand in awe of the LORD, all you offspring of Israel.
- <sup>24</sup>For the LORD does not despise nor abhor the poor in their poverty; neither is the LORD's face hidden from them;

but when they cry out, the LORD hears them.

<sup>25</sup>From you comes my praise in the great assembly:

I will perform my vows in the sight of those who fear the LORD.


<sup>26</sup>The poor shall eat and be satisfied, Let those who seek the LORD give praise! May your hearts live forever!

<sup>27</sup>All the ends of the earth shall remember and turn to the LORD;

all the families of nations shall bow before God.

<sup>28</sup>For dominion belongs to the LORD, who rules over the nations. R

- <sup>29</sup>Indeed, all who sleep in the earth shall bow down in worship; all who go down to the dust, though they be dead, shall kneel before the LORD.
- <sup>30</sup>Their descendants shall serve the LORD, whom they shall proclaim to generations to come.
- <sup>31</sup>They shall proclaim God's deliverance to a people yet unborn, saying to them, "The LORD has acted!" R





Most High and Eternal God, gather into your embrace all those who call out to you using different names, and who have inherited different traditions and scriptures: Muslims, Hindus, Buddhists, Sikhs, and Baha'i, and all who draw on their faith for meaning and hope in life. Help us end interreligious strife; and make those of us who call ourselves

Christian more faithful witnesses of the love that has been made known to us in Christ. We ask in Jesus' name. **Amen** 

Let us pray for those who place no faith in the concept of divinity.

Most High and Eternal God, you created humanity so that all might know peace and have abundant life, a life we find most fully revealed in the person of Jesus of Nazareth. Most High and Eternal God, you give strength to the weary and courage to those who are in danger of losing heart. Heal the sick, comfort the dying, console those who mourn, give safety to travelers, free those unjustly deprived of liberty, and deliver your world from falsehood, hunger, and disease. Hear the prayers of all who call on

you in any trouble, that they may have the joy of receiving your help in their need. We ask in Jesus' name. **Amen** 

Finally, let us pray for all those things for which Jesus himself would have us ask, praying:

Our Father, who art in heaven,
hallowed be thy name,
thy kingdom come,
thy will be done,
on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread;
and forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those
who trespass against us;
and lead us not into temptation,
but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom,
and the power, and the glory,
forever and ever. Amen.



#### Veneration of the Cross

As this takes place, we sing together "Jesus, Remember Me."



When all have returned to their seats the presiding minister invites the congregation to stand, and the service concludes with these words:

We adore you, O Christ, and we bless you. **By your holy cross you have redeemed the world.** 

Send down your abundant blessing, O God, upon your people.

Grant us pardon; bring us comfort. May our faith grow stronger and, in the sure and certain hope of the resurrection, may our future be assured. We pray in the name of Christ. **Amen**
