
Acknowledgment of Territory




The Breaking of the Bread

Many grains were gathered together to make this bread. Many grapes were mixed to make this wine. So we, who are many, are one in Christ.



The seven-striped sunset or lesbian flag represents aspects of lesbian identity: dark orange (gender non-conformity), orange (independence), light orange (community), white (unique relationships to womanhood), pink (serenity & peace), dusty pink (love & sex), and dark rose (femininity). This 2018 design by Emily Gwen serves as a widely recognized symbol for the lesbian community, though other flags are also used.



upwards of \$90,000.00.


